Dear Parents and Carers,

### **School Uniform and Expectations**

I would like to thank you for your support in adhering to our school uniform policy.

School uniform is particularly powerful in providing children with a sense of identify and belonging along with representation of school's expectations. We, therefore, thank you for following our guidelines.

As a reminder, on days when children are wearing full school uniform, trainers must not be worn; children must wear black shoes. Trainers can be worn when your child/ren is/are dressed in their PE kits consisting of black joggers, white t-shirt and black sweat top or hoodie.

If your circumstances make it difficult for you to provide your child with school uniform, please ask to speak to either Mr Byrne (Pastoral Officer), Mrs Cattell (Deputy Headteacher) or me; we will be glad to help where we can. Thank you.

## **Attendance and Punctuality**

Referring to the Ofsted inspection again, attendance and punctuality was inspected, and I would like to thank you for ensuring your child is in school on time, every day and ready to learn. Our current attendance is above national average. Punctuality, however, remains a concern for some children. The information following provides guidance for children arriving late at school and the number of days this can equate to during the course of a school year.





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Typical lateness of 5 minutes each day	3 days lost
10 minutes	6.5 days
15 minutes	10 days
20 minutes	13 days
30 minutes	19 days



It is therefore imperative, children arrive on time and are ready to learn...all becoming an attendance hero!

#### **New Pastoral Officer**

For information, a new member of staff has joined our team: Mr Byrne. He has joined us as Pastoral Officer, replacing Miss Price. Mr Byrne has a wealth of experience of working with children and young adults requiring nurturing support, and he has already started introducing himself to children and meeting with them to support and nurture their emotional wellbeing.

Mr Byrne has also reinstated the Pop-in sessions at lunchtime, an opportunity for children in Years 3-6 to pop into the hall for some quiet, mindfulness time. We are aware that whilst break times are fun and provide opportunity for playing games with friends etc, there are times when a quiet environment is welcoming after a busy morning of lessons. We encourage children to be independent in choosing to access the Pop-in and so far, it has proved to be very popular with many children, choosing to sit quietly with friends, undertake some mindfulness colouring, craft activities or simply a time to enjoy some peacefulness with a book.

You will see Mr Byrne on duty at the start and end of the day outside school and if you would like to introduce yourself or speak to him, please do so. Mr Byrne is available to support children but also any concerns you may have about the wellbeing of your child/ren.

#### **Woodfield Welcomes You Coffee Morning**

Last Friday, we held our first coffee meeting – an opportunity to meet Mrs Cattell and Mr Byrne - but also to learn of ways we can support children and families beyond your child's in-class learning.
