#### MATHS:

Daily arithmetic will take place each morning. Arithmetic is a fundamental branch of mathematics and acts like the basic building blocks for more complicated and advanced topics. This term we will also have daily maths lessons and cover the following topics:

- Money
- Multiplication and Division
- Length and Height
- Mass, capacity and temperature

**ENGLISH:** All children will have a 1 hour English lesson daily.

This term we will be writing a variety of genres. We are starting with a setting description linked to the text 'The Lost Wolf'. Pupils will move onto wanted posters, non-chronological reports and finishing with writing traditional tales.

All children will have a daily phonics/reading lesson.. Each phonics/reading lesson will be at 8.45-9.30am. Read Write Inc helps all children learn to read fluently and at speed so they can focus on developing their skills in comprehension, vocabulary, and spelling. Pupils who have mastered the RWI Programme will be reading a variety of Year 2 texts.
