Dear Parents and Carers,

Continuing with the success of last year's East and West food charity events, we will continue to host the monthly event at Woodfield to support our community families. For new parents and carers to our school, the charity supports families experiencing financial hardship. 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Class Dojo

Class Dojo is a wonderful means of keeping in touch and for sharing information about your child's class. As a school, teachers will endeavour to access the site during the school day but they will only be able to do this during their statutory break and lunchtimes. At all other times, they will be teaching and marking your child's learning and progress which provides information for planning the next stages of teaching and learning. Therefore, if you have a question that you would like to ask or you have information to share with your child's classteacher, please leave a message with either the member of staff on duty in a morning or ask to speak to the teacher at the end of the day when the children are being dismissed.

In recent months, there have been considerable media reports about teachers' workloads and during last term, you will recall some year groups closing to children as teachers supported their professional union associations and their calls for better working conditions. To help support this, teachers will not respond to Dojo messages during the evening or within their own time. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

Data Collection

Thank you to all our families who have returned the recent data collection sheets. It is imperative that we hold current details on our school's information management system. If you have not yet returned your sheets, please do so. If you have misplaced the sheets and require a further copy, please contact the school office and we can send a copy home with your child. 
PE Uniform

As I have previously written, I have happy to support the wearing of PE kits on the days when children have PE. Can I please ask that the kit is in accordance with our uniform policy – black joggers, black sweat top and a white t-shirt. To avoid the losing of sweat tops or hoodies, please ensure they are clearly labelled with your child's name and class. I am always very mindful of the cost of children's clothing and from experience, lost property often builds up during a term with such items and it is very difficult to identify a child's own clothing item when it is not named. Thank you for your support.

School Attendance

I am thrilled to report that our school attendance of 96.15 is at present, slightly above the national expectation of 95%. I would like to thank you for your superb support and for ensuring your child/ren is/ are in school every day. Attendance is scrutinised both by school leaders, governors and all external agencies, including Ofsted; we do not want our school effectiveness to be affected by lower than national attendance. Therefore, I am thrilled with attendance to-date and I am very keen to share this with you.

Towards the end of this half term, letters will be sent to you if there are concerns about punctuality. Arriving late for school has a detrimental effect upon your child's learning and can count towards unauthorised absence recording which can lead to the issuing of fines if falling below an acceptable standard. Maintaining excellent attendance and punctuality ensures the highest of standards for our children and I thank you for your following of our school expectations and legal guidelines.
