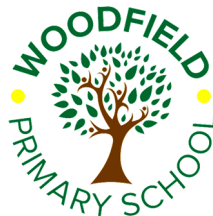

Early Years

Children at Woodfield Primary thrive because we provide opportunities for children to interact and make positive relationships. All children are eager and able to learn and our environment in Early Years is designed to extend and enhance their learning. We encourage children to explore, to take an active role in their learning and become creative and critical thinkers.

Children need to participate in many different activities and experiences to become successful learners. Here at Woodfield, children enjoy a wide range of educational opportunities, covering all seven areas of learning, to ensure they reach their full potential. We recognise children are unique and we ensure each child's individual needs are met.

We enjoy going out on trips, having visits from people in the community, celebrating different festivals and traditions, creating amazing shows, meeting Olympic gymnasts and helping baby chicks and ducks hatch.






In Early Years, we follow a structured routine during the morning, incorporating phonics, literacy and maths. Afternoons involve a short whole class teaching session, followed by child-initiated learning, with focus activities linked to the topic, allowing for free-flow between the classroom and outdoors.

We value discussion, encouraging children to talk about their experiences and share and explain their learning. This is based on caring and positive relationships, which are at the heart of everything we do at Woodfield Primary.

Play is an essential and rich part of children's learning, supporting them in all areas of development. It is a powerful motivator, encouraging children to be creative and to develop their ideas, understanding and language. Our activities engage children in practical, first-hand experiences which will support them to discover, investigate, and make sense of the world around them.

In forest school, children have opportunities to explore the natural world, observe and support wildlife, create their own muddy concoctions, build dens and, most importantly, work together.



My daughter loves reading and I am so pleased with how much the little book bag books have helped. She can't wait to share all her new sounds and words she has learnt in school.

At Woodfield, we love reading. We learn through stories and value the time we spend reading. We use 'Read Write Inc' phonics to help children learn the necessary skills needed to become successful readers. We teach children to recognise sounds and then blend these together to begin to read words. Children are given a 'decodable' book to practise the sounds they have learnt as well as a library book of their own choice.



Our Nursery is a happy, safe and secure place for children to learn, make friends and develop Independence. Our learning opportunities in Nursery cover the 7 areas of learning from the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum. We believe communication and language, physical development, and personal social, emotional development are the foundations for a child's future learning.

Nursery offers morning sessions from 8:45-11:30 Monday to Friday.

Afternoon sessions 12.30-3.15 Monday to Friday.

If eligible, 30 free hours can be provided, allocated on a first come first serve basis, with a small cost for lunchtime provision and the option of food.

Our whole school curriculum is designed to engage and enthuse our children, and ensure they have the knowledge, skills and understanding to prepare them for the next stage in their education. Our curriculum is rooted in our local setting, whilst also recognising our place in the wider world.

Our children embrace the opportunities for trips and residentials, and participate in a wide variety of sporting and academic competitions.





All our children learn a musical instrument, and we provide real life performance opportunities in various settings.



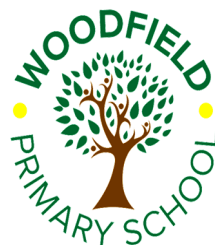
As well as academic excellence, we believe primary school should be about making memories. At Woodfield our children have experiences and build relationships that will last a lifetime.
